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Things to know so you don't die!



1. DON'T BE DUMB

This is a basic rule that has a wide variety of practical applications. If you think you are being dumb, chances are you're being dumb.

2. CONSENT

We have a ZERO TOLERANCE policy for consent violations. If it isn't your body, and you do not have enthusiastic consent, keep your fucking hands to yourself. If you feel as though your boundaries have been violated in this manner, please flag down a ranger or organizer. We strongly advise against testing the edges of this rule. Also: Rules 1, 4. and 7.

3. BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS

Look. It is a canyon in the middle of nowhere. There are rocks. There are holes. There are all manner of things that you need to navigate. PARTICULARLY in the dark. Use a flashlight or headlamp. Stay alert. Tie this directly into the next rule.

4. DON'T BE DUMB

Fucketh Around, Findeth Out. A timeless axiom worth repeating.

5. SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

While the organizers have taken great steps to ensure the safety of those who attend, we ask that you feel empowered to help keep the event safe. In short... if you see someone breaking any of the rules, don't be afraid to tell them. If you don't feel comfortable telling them, then please tell us.

6. LEAVE NO TRACE

As you might expect, this is a leave-no-trace event. What does that mean? It means that if you bring something to the canyon, it must leave the canyon when you do. Please be prepared to be on MOOP patrol and haul your trash home with you.

7. DON'T BE DUMB

Fucks sake... Pay Attention...

8. RESPECT

To most of us, this goes without saying. Respect your own space and that of others. If you feel that your space is threatened by anyone or anything, please grab your nearest Ranger or Organizer.

9. PARTY SMART

Do not engage in activities that put yourself or your fellow attendees at risk... no matter what state you're in.

10. LISTEN

The Organizers and Rangers are there to keep things safe and serene for everyone. Please don't argue with them.

11. TRAVEL SMART

Carpool. Don't Drive at Night. Make all attempts not to stop your vehicle between the border and the canyon. Stick to the washboard road, even if you know the way. Slow and steady will help to get you to and from the event safely and your car in one piece.

12. AGE REQUIREMENT

Children under the age of 21 are not permitted.

13. ANIMALS / PETS

While we love our fur babies, they sadly cannot attend the event.

14. NO SHIFT PODS

Space is limited in the canyon, shift pods take up too much space once tied down properly. Please don't ask for exceptions.

15. NO AMPLIFIED SOUND UNLESS APPROVED BY THE ORGANIZERS

Things to plan for!



Of course, you'll need all of the usual event items, such as your tent, bedding, ID, and ticket (on your phone is fine, but save it locally ahead of time - you will not have service in the canyon). In addition to your usual glamping essentials, there are a few notable things you may want to add to your list.

SEVERE WEATHER GEAR

It doesn't happen all the time, but the canyon has been known to experience high winds and rains. Additionally, depending on your camp location you may experience ground seepage due to the underground hot springs. On your own, or as a group purchase with your camp, you may want to pick up the following:

550 paracord to tie down tents, shade, etc.

2 mil plastic sheeting for under the tent

Rebar Stakes or at least long tent stakes to secure the tents in high wind

PASSPORTS/ID

You really need a passport to get back into the US at this point. You might make it back across the border without one, eventually, but you put everyone else in your vehicle and your caravan at risk by trying your luck.

MEXICAN AUTO INSURANCE

THIS IS REQUIRED. Don't mess around. You can either buy it at the border before you cross, or ahead of time online, but whatever you do, make certain that you have it!

CONTRABAND

DO NOT bring any type of contraband across the border.
Party smart and don't put the event in jeopardy.

How not to get lost!



Many of you have asked about directions, and we're happy to let you know that unlike in the past, you CAN use Google Maps to navigate directly to the canyon by simply searching for "Guadalupe Canyon Hot Springs." Download the map for offline viewing. (We cannot guarantee that this will work with Apple Maps or any other mapping service other than Google.)

There are TWO recommended crossings.

IF ANYONE ASKS WHERE YOU ARE HEADED "CAMPING IN SAN FELIPE"

Tecate: Good choice going north to south, may save you as much as an hour in time, but requires you to drive more in Mx. Be aware this route has two options: "Cuota" (toll road) or "Libre" (free/no-cost road). Be sure to have \$1 and \$5 bills on hand, the tolls will take US dollars. Have at least \$40 to be safe.

Mexicali is our tried-and-true option. We've tested the Google route this way, and it is up-to-date regarding all of the border construction. If you come via Mexicali there is an official highway sign on HWY 2 letting you know where to make a U-turn with specific reference to Guadalupe Canyon.

The turn from HWY 2 towards the canyon is marked with a tri-post sign front, last seen sporting red and green.

Once you've exited the highway, continue straight for around 50km. At the turn, we will have a sign posted for you. (Veterans: The olive grove no longer exists.)

The time from exiting the highway to Greeters is around 55min based on an average speed of 35-40mph.

DO NOT TAKE THE LAKEBED - IT IS CURRENTLY MUDDY AND DANGEROUS.

Coming home, you can check out the border wait times at <https://bwt.cbp.gov/> if you have service.

Make sure to map your return route via the *specific* type of border crossing your party is eligible for - ie Sentri, Ready Lane (RFID Lane), or the "All Traffic Lane." You can Google this as well. (Otherwise, Google WILL try to map you through Sentri - don't play that game.)

Lastly, if you have a recent passport that has a camera-like symbol on the cover, or if you have a passport card or a REAL ID driver's license, you are eligible for the Ready Lane.

When you arrive!



PLACEMENT

Adhering to it is not a suggestion, it is a requirement. You and your campmates are required to camp in the site specified prior to your arrival. Please be aware that the canyon is small, and each campsite can only fit a specific number of tents. It is essential for everyone to be spatially aware of others. The average tent site is able to accommodate footprints of 10'x10' or smaller. **SHIFT PODS ARE NOT ALLOWED!** They take up too much space in the campsites.

PARKING

Our goal with parking is to be fair and also rational when working around arrival and exodus schedules. Each campsite is located in specific colored area of the map - blue, yellow, green, or red. Depending on where you are placed, you may be able to park within your campsite. Otherwise, our parking staff will guide you to the nearest location available to you. If you would like to ensure an easy exodus for yourself, it is a good idea to simply park at the lot at the main gate.

LEAVE NO TRACE

Everyone is responsible for removing their own garbage. We strive to leave the canyon a little more beautiful than when we arrived. Please assign someone from your camp to do a final trash sweep before leaving. There will be a \$500 minimum fine if a camp is found to have left garbage. Do not collect any rocks or plants from the desert (and certainly no animals) and leave your pets of any kind at home.

MEDICATIONS

Even though we have a professional medical team on site, please talk with your campmates or camp lead about where your meds are located in case of emergency. This includes epi pens.

CONSENT

We do our best to cultivate a safe and enjoyable experience for all of our participants, which includes having Rangers on-hand. However, we pride ourselves on Leyenda's culture of consent. Always ask for consent. **ONLY YES MEANS YES.** Intoxication of any sort is not consent. Always be aware of your surroundings and do not hesitate to step in if something seems wrong. We're all here to look out and care for one another.

DOWNSTREAM WATER

RECENT FLOODS AND SHIFTS TO THE TERRAIN IN THE CANYON HAVE MADE IT SO THERE ARE PARTS OF THE WATER AREAS THAT ARE.. UNCLEAN. SO WE URGE YOU NOT TO SWIM IN THE WATER THAT IS NOT IN YOUR CAMP HOT TUBS OR THE POOL AREAS.
